## DETAILED ITINERARY

### Day 1 – Departure to Seoul, Korea

Depart on overnight flights to Seoul, South Korea.

**Day 2 – Seoul** Upon arrival, transfer to the hotel then gather for a welcome dinner. *D*

**Day 3 – Seoul** Begin your journey with a warm welcome and an enlightening lecture on Korean culture by a university professor. Stroll Insadong's Antique Street, lined with teashops, galleries, and Joseon-era architecture. In the afternoon, admire autumn's vibrant hues at Changdeok Palace and its Secret Garden, a favorite retreat of Joseon kings. Then savor vegetarian temple cuisine. *BLD*

**Day 4 – Seoul** At the Museum of Contemporary History, trace Korea's transformation from its tumultuous past to its rise as a modern, advanced nation. This afternoon, visit Imjingak at the edge of the DMZ, as your Trip Leader offers insights into Korea's history and geography. Peer into North Korea from Dora Observatory. *BL*

**Day 5 – Gyeongju** Take the KTX high-speed train to Gyeongju and explore UNESCO World Heritage site Yandong Village. Visit a traditional Hanok home as you learn Joseon-era traditions. *BLD*



**Day 6 – Gyeongju** This afternoon, head to Bulguksa Temple and Seokguram Grotto, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that has some of the original pagodas dating from the year 751. At the Geongju National Museum, learn the importance and main historical aspects of the ancient Silla Kingdom, which ruled two-thirds of the Korean Peninsula from this capital city from 57BC to 935AD. Walk through the Royal Tumuli Park and go inside the Flying Horse Tomb. Enjoy a royal dining experience at Gyeongju's most historic restaurant, savoring Korean Royal Court Cuisine served on elegant copper dishes. Then, enjoy a stroll around the illuminated Wolji Pond, taking in the scenic viewpoints and reflections. *BLD*



**Day 7 – Busan** A lecture with a university professor traces the history and importance of Buddhism and its relationship to Gyeongju’s history. Next, in a hands-on cooking class, learn about the ingredients and process of creating a typical Korean meal, featuring beef bulgogi, then we enjoy what we’ve made for lunch. Depart to Busan, stopping for a visit Haedong Yonggungsa Temple – the only seaside temple in Korea. *BL*

**Day 8 – Busan** Discover Busan, where towering skyscrapers meet traditional charm. Visit the UN Memorial Cemetery, the world’s only UN burial ground, and explore the vibrant Gamcheon Culture Village, adorned with colorful murals and sculptures. Stroll through the bustling Jagalchi Fish Market and traditional market streets before ascending Busan Tower for sweeping views of the city and harbor. *BLD*

**Day 9 – Jeju Island** Fly to Jeju Island and explore its rich heritage at the Folklore and Natural History Museum. Stroll through Dongmun Traditional Market, a bustling hub for local goods and fresh produce. Check into our hotel situated on the scenic coast. *BLD*

**Day 10 – Jeju Island** At the Jeju April 3rd Peace Park, trace the events of the 1948 Jeju uprising, then take a 1.5-mile walk around Sangumburi Crater rim for panoramic views of Hallasan and the surrounding landscape. Stroll through Seongeup Village, a 500-year-old community with traditional thatched-roof homes, before heading to Seongsan Peak for stunning coastal views. *BL*



**Day 11 – Jeju Island** Explore the southwest of Jeju Island, beginning with the stunning Cheonjeon and Jeonbang Falls, Asia’s only waterfall that drops directly into the sea. Visit Beophwan Village, where we meet the Haenyo - women divers to learn about their daily life. End your day with a peaceful stroll through a botanic garden created on reclaimed land. *BL*

**Day 12 – Seoul, Korea** Fly from Jeju to Seoul domestic airport. After lunch, check



in to the hotel. The afternoon is at leisure. This evening we’ll share a final Farewell Dinner together in a lovely traditional restaurant. *BLD*

**Day 13 – Departure** Transfer to Incheon International Airport for departure. *B*

### PAYMENT

The trip deposit is payable by credit card in the Conservancy Travel Registration portal.

- At registration, you may set automatic payment by credit card for the final payment due date
- You may make final payment by credit card by returning to the My Account feature of your trip registration, if you set up a username and password when you paid your Trip Deposit

- You may make final payment by check. Write your Trip Name and Departure Date on the check memo. Payments by check must be received in the Conservancy Travel business office at least two weeks prior to the final payment deadline

Conservancy Travel reserves the right to cancel any reservations not paid in full by the final payment due date. Reservations accepted after the final payment date require payment in full upon reservation.

A minimum number of guests is required to operate the trip and to include the services of the Sponsoring Organization's lecturer or host. Please call your Travel Planner for details.

### GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**Tour Price Includes:** Accommodations based on double occupancy, private transportation; meals, sightseeing, and airport transfers described as included in the detailed itinerary; hotel taxes; cruise line fees and port charges (where applicable); entrance fees for included sightseeing; the services of an in-country tour manager; English-speaking guide(s); luggage handling for one bag per person (where available); specific items and gratuities as described in each Trip Price detail as included.

**Not Included in The Trip Price:** International airfare and baggage fees; passport fees / visa fees; Travel Insurance, DAN insurance (Diving only); items of a personal nature, laundry, communications charges; immunizations and inoculations; beverages not detailed as included, increases or additional government fees implemented after the published tour price, gratuity to (as applicable) Conservancy Travel Tour Manager, Safari Guides, safari camp personnel, ship personnel; specific items described as Not Included or Optional in the specific Trip exclusions.

Participant agrees to pay Conservancy Travel the designated Trip Price, the required Deposit Amount, and the balance of all monies due by the final payment due date as specified in each trip's detailed itinerary and on the order confirmation.

**Published Rates:** Rates are in US dollars and based on current rates of exchange at time of publication. Changes in tour rates are rare, and caused by extraordinary circumstances outside Conservancy Travel's control. All prices are per person based on Double or Single Rate. All prices, fuel surcharges, included airfares and government levies are subject to change without prior notice. Conservancy Travel reserves the right to adjust published rates according to fluctuations in exchange rates.

**Single Rate:** Accommodations are priced on two people sharing one room. If single occupancy is requested, or if you request to share a double room but we cannot assign a suitable roommate, the single rate applies. If a reservation changes from double to single occupancy for any reason, the single rate applies. If you are assigned a roommate but request to change to a single room during the trip, the pro-rated single rate applies.

**Changes to Reservation:** If a Participant makes changes to a registration after confirmation and before the final payment due date, a \$100 per person fee will be charged. If changes are made after the final payment due date, a \$300 per person fee may apply. Any additional fees or penalties associated with the change are the responsibility of the Participant.

**Travel Protection:** Travel Insurance is not included in the tour price. Commonwealth Club Travel will provide you information about travel insurance upon booking.

**Air Arrangements:** Participants may choose to make their own air arrangements, or request assistance from Conservancy Travel's Air Desk. All flight purchases are transacted between the passenger and the Air Desk service provider, whose fee schedule is independent of Conservancy Travel. All changes and/or cancellations for purchased air arrangements are the responsibility of the Participant.

**Trip Cancellation by Conservancy Travel:** In the rare event that a Trip is canceled by Conservancy Travel for reasons other than force majeure or extraordinary causes beyond CT's control, all monies paid to Conservancy Travel will be refunded in full including

change fees on air tickets purchased from Conservancy Travel. Conservancy Travel cannot accept responsibility for any other expenses incurred in preparing for the journey, including non-refundable or non-transferable airline tickets not purchased or provided by Conservancy Travel. If a journey is canceled by Conservancy Travel for reasons of force majeure or extraordinary causes beyond Conservancy Travel's control, Conservancy Travel will make every attempt to recoup the maximum reimbursements from operators and will in turn refund all recoverable costs.

**Travel Documents and Immunizations:** For International Trips, Participants must possess a passport valid for six months after the trip end date, and any visas or entry permits required by the trip destination(s). Any permits required for the included trip activities are included in the trip price. Immunizations required or recommended for travel are the responsibility of the Participant. Information on destination requirements and recommendations for climate, clothing, baggage, gear, and similar matters are given in good faith but without responsibility on the part of Conservancy Travel.

**Health:** A Participant must be in good overall health to participate. International Travel is physically demanding and may involve extended air travel, time zone changes, climate and dietary conditions that differ from home and may impact Participant health. All trips require that a Participant be capable of independent personal care and physical mobility. Independent physical activities include embarking and disembarking all trip conveyances with minimal assistance; climbing stairs and stepping over raised thresholds.

Other physical activity requirements as specified in the Trip detailed itinerary. Participants requiring assistance must travel with a companion who is solely responsible for providing such assistance, including handling any personal equipment a Participant requires. Any physical or mental health condition that may require special medical attention or physical assistance must be disclosed in writing prior to registration so that Conservancy Travel may evaluate whether participation is feasible. All Participants should consult with their personal physician about the suitability of the destination and must complete and return any personal information and/or medical forms required.

Conservancy Travel will assist when possible with changes due to undisclosed health conditions or services required due to injury or illness during the trip, but any associated costs are at the Participant's expense.

**Dietary Restrictions:** Participant dietary restrictions must be stated in writing to Conservancy Travel prior to the final payment due date. Conservancy Travel may not be able to guarantee medically required special diets. Some destinations are unable or unaccustomed to some dietary restrictions. Conservancy Travel will request in advance, but does not guarantee delivery of specifically catered dietary restrictions for all meals in all circumstances.
