
# Havana, Trinidad & Cienfuegos April 3-10, 2016



















# **Itinerary**

# Day 1 U.S./Havana

Depart Miami on our charter flight for Havana. (Travelers arrive into Miami the prior evening, independently.) Arrive Havana in the afternoon and go immediately to lunch. Visit the Plaza de la Revolucíon, before checking into the Hotel Parque Central, perfectly located in the central part of the city. Tonight enjoy a welcome drink and introductions, followed by our welcome dinner. (*L*,*D*)

# Day 2 Havana

After a morning lecture by a Cuban journalist, we embark on a walking tour. Havana is a treasure trove of architectural styles spanning six centuries. Explore Old Havana, including the Plaza de Armas, Plaza de la Catedral, Plaza de San Francisco (with buildings dating from the 18th century) and the Plaza Vieja, the oldest plaza in Havana, dating from the 16th century. Meet artists at the Taller de Grafica Experimental. More than Havana's printmaking workshop, it is a studio and a school. In the early evening join a lively and musical lecture about the history of Cuban Music by a professor and musicologist. Dinner is at La Guarida. Housed on the third floor of a large old town house, this paladar carries the charming ambience of the 1920s. (B,L,D)

# Day 3 Havana

Attend a briefing by our foreign service staff at the the newly reinstated U.S. Embassy. Take an architect-led tour of Western Havana, including the University of Havana, the Havana Libre, the Riviera Hotel and the Christopher Colon Cemetery. Lunch is at the whimsical home of artist Jose Fuster, who has made a major contribution to rebuilding and decorating the fishing town of Jaimanitas. Pending ministerial approval, visit Instituto Superior de Arte (ISA) the premier school in Cuba for students studying music, visual and performing arts. Finally, relax in the beautiful home of collector and art dealer, Milagros Borges. Dinner is in Miramar. (*B,L,D*)

### Day 4 Havana

Attend a private dance performance of the Compañía Irene Rodríguez (flamenco). Meet Irene and the company, considered by many to be the finest flamenco dancers in Cuba. Continue exploring more of Havana's architecture – Central Park, the Bacardi Building, and the Hotel Nacional. After lunch on the Malecon.

we continue to Callejon de Hamel, a street in Havana known for its lively murals, and an area popular with followers of the Santeria religion. Learn about Santeria and visit the home of a *babalao*, a Yoruba priestess. Schedule permitting you have the option to attend a baseball game, or explore the Fabrica de Arte Cuba, the most collaborative art project in Havana. (*B,L*)

# Day 5 Havana

Attend a lecture by a prominent economist about Cuba's current transition. Enjoy a curator-led tour of the Museum of Cuban Art which is dedicated exclusively to Cuban Art. Enjoy lunch on your own, then later gather for a dance demonstration and salsa lesson at Casa del Son. Dinner tonight is at a unique Cuban-Creole *paladar*. (*B*,*D*)

# Day 6 Cienfuegos/Bay of Pigs

Depart Havana early this morning for the Bay of Pigs and Zapata National Park, Cuba's most important wetland area. Visit the Playa Giron Museum with displays about the failed invasion of Cuba by Cuban exiles and the CIA. Continue to Cienfuegos for lunch. Cienfuegos is a UNESCO World Heritage Site as it contains six buildings from 1819-50, 327 buildings from 1851-1900, and 1,188 buildings from the 20th century. There is no other place in the Caribbean that contains such a remarkable cluster of Neoclassical structures. See the architecture, visit with artists, and experience a concert and discussion with the highly respected Cienfuegos choir. Check into the Hotel Jagua, before dinner at the Palacio Del Valle. (B,L,D)

# Day 7 Trinidad

Depart for Trinidad and the Valle de los Ingenios (valley of the sugar mills) the most important sugar producing region during colonial times and a UNESCO Cultural Heritage Site. Explore this charming town of cobblestone, Spanish colonial style architecture, museums, and galleries. Pay a visit to a local maternity home and meet with local artists, before returning to Cienfuegos. Tonight celebrate your Cuban journey at our farewell dinner. (*B,L,D*)

# Day 8 Havana/U.S.

Check out of the hotel and depart for the airport for our flight to Miami. (*B*)

# What to Expect

Travelers must be in overall good health and with good mobility in order to enjoy this program fully. There is considerable walking over uneven terrain and old city streets throughout the tour. Many places have stairs without handrails. In addition, many buildings do not have elevators, or the elevators may not be functioning. Restaurants in private homes often require walking up several flights of stairs. This is a busy program, with many activities. We are sure you will enjoy the trip, but want you to be aware of the physical requirements and pace.

# **Trip Details**

### Dates:

April 3–10, 2016 (independent arrivals to Miami on April 2)

# **Group Size:**

Pricing is based on a minimum of 15 travelers and a maximum of 25.

# Cost:

\$5,095, per person, based on double occupancy; \$500 Single room supplement (limited), includes all land and charter flight from Miami.

## Included:

5 nights accommodation at 4–5 Star Hotel Parque Central Havana; 2 nights at Hotel Jagua or similar; round trip airfare MIA-HAV-CFG-MIA; Cuban departure tax; meals as listed in itinerary (B=Breakfast L=Lunch and D=dinner. Includes at least one beverage: water, beer, mojito, or soft drink. Wine with welcome and farewell dinners.); bottled water; air conditioned bus throughout the trip equipped with water; admission to all museums and public buildings listed in itinerary; speaker fees and conference room rentals; gratuities for all group activities – including meals, baggage handling, bus driver, and local Cuban guide; Commonwealth Club representative and Cuban tour manager; Cuban Tourist Visa; Cuban Medical Insurance (health and evacuation); Compliance with US Treasury Department.

# Not included:

Airfare to Miami; hotel in Miami; airline baggage fees; meals and beverages other than listed on itinerary; individualized hotel expenses (mini bar, room service, laundry fees, internet); personal activities and additional gratuities.

### Terms and Conditions

**Reservations:** A \$1,000 per person deposit, along with a completed and signed Reservation Form, will reserve a place for participants on this program. The balance of the trip is due 90 days prior to departure and *must be paid by check*.

Cancellation and Refund Policy: Notification of cancellation must be received in writing. At the time we receive your written cancellation, the following penalties will apply:

- 91 days or more prior to departure: \$500 per persor
- 90-60 days to departure: \$1,000 deposi
- 59-1 days prior to departure: 100% far
